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INTRODUCTION

re you afraid of sharing the Gospel to other people?

Do you know how to explain the Gospel message to others?

This booklet has some important teachings and tips to equip you to overcome the fear of sharing Christ. This eBook also has tips and guidelines to help you on what to talk about when explaining or sharing the Gospel message.

5 Reasons Why Christians Should Share the Gospel

Why is it important to share the gospel? According to Scripture it is the duty of every born again Christian to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Gospel is also known as the "good news". In the Bible *the Gospel* pertains to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ in order to deliver humanity from the consequence of sin and reconcile us with God eternally.

1 Corinthians 15:1-4 says: Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, 2 and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you — unless you believed in vain. 3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, 4 that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures

So the gospel message is about Jesus Christ and why He lived the perfect life we could not live and took the punishment we deserved through His crucifixion on the cross for our sins. He then resurrected to prove His victory over sin and death.

Below are 5 Reasons why Christians should share the Gospel

1. The message of the Gospel leads to Salvation

The purpose of sharing the gospel is to lead the lost towards salvation in Christ. When we share the gospel it's because we want unbelievers to appreciate the work Jesus did on the cross to save humanity from sin, and then persuade them to respond and believe in Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Romans 1:18 says that the Gospel is "the power of God for salvation for everyone who believes..."

In **1 Corinthians 15:1-2** Paul again links his preaching of the gospel to the salvation of those who receive and believe the gospel.

Therefore one of the main purposes of the gospel is to lead people to salvation by sharing the love of God and the sacrifice Christ made on the cross so that we inherit eternal life if we believe in Him (John 3:16).

2. Jesus commanded us to share the Gospel

Jesus Christ commissioned and instructed us to share the gospel to every creature. **Mark 16:15 NLT** says: *And then*

He told them, "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone."

So the gospel is meant for everyone. It is to be shared without discrimination to all kinds of people from all kinds of cultures and belief systems.

Furthermore, Jesus has instructed every Christian believer to share the Good News because **every Christian is a minister of God.**

3. God loves humanity and He does not want to see people perish

God loves humanity even though we are sinners. **Romans 5:8** says: *But God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*

So God's main motive for desiring to save humanity is because He loves us and He is "not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Peter 3:9)

Therefore we should seek to imitate the same love and desire that God has for humanity. As Christians we must be motivated by love to share the gospel because just like God, we should not want to see anyone perish. So we share the gospel because we love God and we love others, and because we desire to see people repent and be spiritually reconciled to God.

4. Hell is real and Hell is eternal

Receiving the gospel message, followed by believing in Jesus as Lord and Savior will lead to eternal life. However, rejecting the gospel means rejecting Christ and this ultimately leads to death or eternal punishment in hell.

One of the reasons why Jesus was crucified and why He paid the penalty for our sins, was to save believers from experiencing eternal punishment.

Romans 6:23 says: For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Revelation 20:15 says: And if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire.

We must therefore share the gospel with a reverential fear of God because we understand the reality and the eternal consequences if people die and go to hell.

In **Luke 12:5** Jesus says: "But I will warn you whom to fear: fear Him who, after He has killed, has authority to cast into hell. Yes, I tell you, fear Him!"

5. Understanding & Appreciation of the Gospel prevents deception

When people believe and appreciate the true Gospel, then they will be able to recognize a false gospel. It is only when we have knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the **true gospel** that we can avoid being deceived by various false gospels.

Without an understanding and appreciation of the true gospel, people can be deceived by various false gospels such as **antinomianism**, **universalism**, **salvation by works** and also money-centred heretical teachings such as **prosperity gospel** and **seed faith doctrines**.

There are many dangers associated with false gospels and teachings.

In the New Testament, letters such as **Romans**, **Galatians**, **2 Corinthians and Titus** frequently combat false teachings and false gospels.

Paul says the following in **Galatians 1:6-9**: "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel — 7 not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. 8 But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed. 9 As we have said before, so now I say again: If

anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed."

So the duty of every true Christian believer is to present the true Biblical gospel of Jesus Christ. We should avoid preaching any message that opposes the true nature and character of God and distorts the true purpose of Christ's finished work on the cross.

Conclusion

Sharing the gospel should be a Christian lifestyle. It should be something we do whenever we have the opportunity and at any venue, location and in any circumstance.

How to Overcome the Fear of Sharing Christ

Many Christians fear the idea of sharing Christ or the Gospel for various reasons. However, winning souls to Christ and sharing His Gospel is one of the most important things a Christian can do. So how can we overcome the fear of sharing **the Gospel** to others?

1. Expect to be Rejected

One of our main fears is the possibility of being rejected by people whom we try to share the Gospel. People will reject the Gospel for different reasons. Some will ridicule you as a Christian and your message; some will be offended by the Gospel message you're sharing; others will be spiritually blinded from understanding the message of Christ; others will reject you because they believe in a false gospel or false ideology that contradicts the word of God.

However we must understand that rejection is a part of human life. Rejection is also part of Christian ministry and evangelism.

In a fallen world where people have free will, one will certainly encounter people who will accept the Gospel of Christ with open arms whilst others will defiantly reject the Gospel.

Jesus Christ Himself, the most perfect Person to walk the earth was rejected by people to the point of crucifixion though He was blameless, sinless and holy.

John 1:11 says that Jesus *came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him.*

Not only was Jesus rejected, but many prophets in the Old Testament and Christians in the New Testament faced rejection to the extent of being persecuted and killed for preaching the Gospel.

Therefore if anyone rejects Jesus Christ or rejects the Gospel, it is not you whom they reject, but it is the Author of the Gospel whom they reject. The job of the Christian is to only share and proclaim Christ and His word.

In **Luke 10:16** Jesus says: "The one who hears you hears Me, and the one who rejects you rejects Me, and the one who rejects Me rejects Him who sent Me."

2. Do not fear that you might offend people

Another major reason why Christians may fear sharing Christ is because we fear that our message might offend others.

For example, some Christians may fear talking about hell and judgment because such topics might be deemed "offensive" or "unloving" or "provoking" to talk about. However it is not unloving to warn people about hell and judgment because these issues are part of the Gospel of Christ.

The Bible says: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes..." (Romans 1:16).

It is unfortunate that a life-saving message such as the Gospel of Christ will cause many people to become offended. However the Scripture says that the gospel is an offense to those who are perishing.

1 Corinthians 1:18 says: For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Unfortunately in a fallen world many will refuse the truth and instead opt to believe a lie. Many will reject the light and opt to follow darkness; many will reject Christ and opt to follow someone or something else. However it is an undeniable fact that sharing Christ will offend people. It is the reason why Christ Himself was crucified and it is the reason why many Christians throughout history and to this present day face persecution. The world will always take offense to Christ Himself and all that He represents.

In **John 15:18-19** Jesus says: *"If the world hates you, know that it has hated Me before it hated you. 19 If you were of the*

world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you."

3. Understand that the battle is for souls

Whenever we share the Gospel it is because we are trying to win souls to Christ. The Bible says *"he who wins souls is wise"* (Proverbs 11:30)

In **Luke 15:7** Jesus says: "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance."

So the crux of why we share Christ is because every Christian believer is engaged in a spiritual battle to win souls from the kingdom of darkness and into the kingdom of God.

The battle is not about winning a soul to your ministry or denomination or church. The battle is about winning people specifically to Jesus Christ so that they may be genuinely born again.

God and the devil are fighting to win souls. The devil wants to deceive and blind as many people as possible so that they end up in hell, whilst God desires to see people repent and enter eternal life through Christ. **2 Corinthians 4:4** says: In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

2 Peter 3:9 says that God is "not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance."

So we must understand the gravity of why we share the Gospel. We are trying to win lost souls to Jesus Christ. By sharing Christ we are participating in opening the spiritual eyes of lost souls and pointing them to follow the Lord and Saviour.

4. Remember that sharing Christ is an act of love for others

To overcome the fear of sharing Christ, we must learn to love. We must be motivated by the love of God and the love for people.

The two greatest commandments that Jesus gave to His disciples is to love God and to love others (Matthew 22:37-40).

If we truly love people, then we would share the Gospel and warn them about eternal punishment. If we truly love people then we would speak about the Person of Jesus Christ and the free saving grace of God. True genuine love which is sourced from God is capable of equipping us to deal with the fear of sharing Christ. Scripture says that *"perfect love casts out fear"* (1 John 4:18)

Love is always a good motivator. It's because of love, that in **John 3:16** God was motivated to send His only begotten Son to pay for the sins of the world. Therefore if we fear sharing Christ and sharing His Gospel, then we need to personally and internally assess our ability to love God and to genuinely love people.

5. Love the truth and hate deception

Overcoming the fear of sharing Christ requires us to love the truth found in God's word and to hate any form of deception.

Many people have fallen prey to false ideologies; false doctrines and false teachers whose ultimate purpose is lead people astray and into eternal punishment.

The Bible teaches that the truth will set us free **(John 8:31-32).** Without truth, people will be deceived and perish. Without truth there is no spiritual freedom in Christ.

Jesus Christ is the way, *the truth* and the life **(John 14:6)**. When we love the truth, we are excited to share it and we want everyone to know it.

Conclusion

We must not be ashamed of Jesus Christ and nor should we be ashamed of the Gospel. Within us, Christ must increase while we decrease.

As true believers, we must not fear nor deny our Lord and Saviour.

In **Matthew 10:32-33** Jesus says: "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, 33 but whoever denies Me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven."

We should not fear to share Christ because we have the Holy Spirit inside of us.

2 Timothy 1:7 says: "For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control."

The sharing of the Gospel of Christ requires the continuous participation and leading of the Holy Spirit. The spiritual conversion and regeneration of any soul from an unbeliever and into a Christian is not by the technique or skill of any human – but it is because of the truth of the Gospel combined with the work of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of the people to whom we share the Gospel.

As we boldly share the truth, we must trust that the Holy Spirit will do His work. God has not given us a spirit of fear – but He has given us the Holy Spirit and His word to equip us for every good work to the glory of Jesus Christ.

How to Explain the Gospel and Share your Faith

So let's say you wish to explain the gospel to a friend, a workmate or a total stranger: What are the basic issues you should raise as you share the gospel? What are your talking points? How can you bring an unbeliever to the discovery that he/she needs Jesus Christ as Saviour? In this article we will look at about 6 talking points to help guide your conversation as you share the gospel of Jesus Christ to others.

Sharing the gospel should be an important part of every Christian believer's life. You don't have to be an ordained minister to evangelize or to share the gospel to others. The gospel must be shared by every Christian because every Christian believer has been given the mandate to share the gospel of Christ or to share the Christian faith.

You also do not need to be ashamed to share the gospel even if people try to mock you, scoff or discourage you from sharing the gospel. You do not need to fear sharing your faith or allow anyone to think that you're not qualified to share the gospel **(Romans 1:16)**. The gospel is the most important message that everyone needs to hear because at its core this message speaks of the love of God and the sacrifice that He made to save humanity.

So in order to be able to explain the gospel to others, you must have some understanding of what the gospel means and you must understand the essential elements of the gospel message.

WHAT IS THE FOCUS OF THE GOSPEL MESSAGE?

The word "gospel" means *good news* and so the gospel is the message of God's redemption plan for mankind which was completed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Without Jesus Christ man faces eternal punishment and separation from God because of sin. The good news is that God offers us salvation and eternal life as a free gift because of the debt for sin which Christ paid on the cross.

The true gospel is defined in the Bible in **1 Corinthians 15:1-4** and these scriptures clearly define the essential elements of the gospel message. The gospel message speaks about the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and why His finished work on the cross is of importance to humanity. In **1 Corinthians 2:2** it says: For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified.

So the focal point of the gospel message (and the entire Bible in context) is on Jesus Christ and Him crucified, so that He may save humanity from the power of sin and death.

The gospel message is important because it is the power of God for salvation **(Romans 1:16).**

Therefore our explanation of the gospel must always point people to Jesus Christ and the cross. Our explanation of the gospel must bring people to a realization that they need Jesus Christ and that without Him they will face certain doom. The gospel will always exalt Christ and the price He paid with His blood for the salvation of man.

John 3:16-17 says "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him."

6 TIPS or TALKING POINTS AS YOU SHARE THE GOSPEL TO SOMEONE

Where possible it is also important use scripture as you share your faith **(2 Timothy 3:16-17)**. Below are some talking points to guide your conversation with an unbeliever as you explain the gospel or share your Christian faith.

1. Talk about sin. Explain how sin came into the world through Adam & Eve (Genesis 3:1-24). Explain how the whole of humanity inherited the sin nature because of Adam (Romans 5:12-13, Romans 3:23)

2. Talk about the temporary and eternal consequences of sin. The ultimate penalty for sin and choosing to live without Christ is eternal punishment (Romans
6:23; Revelation 21:8, Galatians 5:19-21).

3. Talk about Jesus Christ coming to save sinners. In the world nobody is perfect. We are all sinners who cannot pay to God the price for our sins. So explain that Jesus was crucified on the cross to pay the debt for sin that we could not pay ourselves (Luke 19:10, Luke 5:31-32).

4. Explain that salvation and eternal forgiveness of sin is offered by God as a free gift. Talk about the love and grace of God and that one does not need to earn his/her salvation through works because Jesus redeemed us by

His blood and by His sufficient work on the cross (Ephesians 2:8-9, Titus 3:5).

5. Explain that Jesus Christ is the only way to

Heaven. Christ alone is the Mediator between God and man. Without Christ we cannot be reconciled to God or have a relationship with Him. Therefore explain that salvation is through no one else but Jesus Christ alone (John 14:6, 1 Timothy 2:5, Acts 4:12).

6. Explain that salvation is received through believing or faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour (John 1:12, Romans 10:9-13). You can ask the person to make a decision to accept Christ through faith and commit to becoming a follower of Jesus Christ.

The above are Biblical guidelines. Of course it's always possible that the Holy Spirit may guide you in a different way or through a different method. However the focal point of the gospel will always be about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Therefore even as the Holy Spirit guides you, His purpose will be to glorify Christ alone and to convert people because of the gospel.

John 16:8 says that the Holy Spirit will *convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment*:

Jesus says the following about the work of the Holy Spirit in **John 16:14**: *"He will glorify Me, for He will take what is Mine and declare it to you"*

Therefore the work of the Holy Spirit will always be to glorify Christ and point people to the gospel. Even as you share your personal testimony of faith, let your testimony reflect the fact that Jesus Christ is Lord and Saviour because He has redeemed you from the power of sin through His death on the cross. Let it also be known that God has adopted you to become a child of God because of His love and grace and not because of your personal effort or works.

Some Important Things To Remember When You Share The Gospel

- Ask the Holy Spirit to lead you during every conversation you have with anyone as you share the gospel (John 14:26, John 15:13-15, Acts 1:8)
- Don't be ashamed or afraid to share the true gospel (Romans 1:16). People might mock you or discourage you from sharing the gospel – including professing Christians – but remain steadfast in sharing the true gospel message.

- Only the Holy Spirit has the power to genuinely convert a person and to bring that person to repentance (John 15:8-11). Your job is to simply share the word of God. Your job is to share the gospel and let God do the rest.
- Be a person who studies the word of God and rightly divides it (2 Timothy 2:15)

Never Share A False Gospel

There are many false gospels that have infiltrated the church today and such false gospels have created false converts and led many people astray.

Galatians 1:6-9 and **2 Corinthians 11:4** warns against sharing a false gospel and the consequences of sharing a false gospel.

These false gospels which are popular but dangerous include the **prosperity gospel**, **hyper grace** / **antinomianism**, **universalism**, **salvation by works** and various **Word of Faith theology** and **New Apostolic Reformation teachings**.

Therefore the true gospel always leads back to Jesus Christ and the cross. Unlike many of the false gospels, the true gospel exalts the work of Christ and not the work of man.

Conclusion

May the Lord guide you and may the Holy Spirit equip you whenever you share the gospel of Jesus Christ.

What is the Romans Road to Salvation?

As Christians we should know the true Gospel and we should also know how to explain it. The most important message that all of humanity needs to hear is the message of the Gospel or Good News about Jesus Christ and His finished work on the Cross.

One of the evangelism tools that presents a simple guideline for Christians to explain the Gospel is **The Romans Road to Salvation**.

The Romans Road to Salvation is a wonderful evangelism resource which takes all its Scriptures from Paul's letter of Romans and provides steps through the Scriptures to help a person to understand why he/she requires salvation through Jesus Christ.

Below are 5 "Stops" along the Romans Road to Salvation which Christians can use to explain the Gospel of Jesus Christ

Stop #1 – Romans 3:23 – *for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God*

Stop #1 focuses on the fact we are all sinners by nature and by choice. Therefore we are not inherently good according to God's perfect standards. All human beings are sinners before a just and holy God. We are all guilty of breaking at least one or more of God's Ten Commandments. We each need God's eternal forgiveness because we have all sinned against Him. So by nature and by choice we have failed to meet God's perfect standard of righteousness. We cannot meet God's perfect standard of righteousness with our own effort even if we tried to. This is what it means to fall short of the glory of God: we always miss God's perfect standards because of our sin nature.

Stop #2 – Romans 6:23 – For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Stop #2 focuses on the fact that sin has consequences but God can offer salvation as a free gift.

So according to **Romans 6:23** *"the wages of sin is death"*. This means that the impact of sin in our life is that it brought both physical and spiritual death to humanity. One day we will all die a physical death.

And if we do not get saved before we die, the Bible says we will also experience a second death because of sin **(Revelation 21:8).** This second death is eternal punishment in hell.

However thankfully there is a way that humanity can escape the eternal wages of sin. How?

The answer according to **Romans 6:23** is that God offers salvation or eternal life as a free gift through Jesus Christ. Therefore even though we deserve death as a wage because of our sin, the grace of God is such that He offers us salvation as a free gift.

Stop #3 – Romans 5:8 – but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Stop #3 focuses on **how** and **why** God offers humanity the free gift of salvation. It also focuses on God's love even for people who are at enmity with Him. **Romans 5:8** speaks of the love that God has for sinners. Therefore God loves us so much that He does not wish to leave us in a state of sin forever and neither does He desire to see us suffering from the eternal consequence of sin.

As sinners we cannot earn our way into heaven through our own effort to be good or by our own righteousness **(Ephesians 2:8-9).** We cannot pay our own debt for sin because we constantly miss God's perfect mark or standards in our daily life.

Therefore God sent His Son Jesus Christ who lived a perfect earthly life to become humanity's perfect sacrifice for sin. Jesus came to redeem us and pay the debt for sin that humanity could not pay. According to **Ephesians 1:7** in Christ "we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace"

Stop #4 – Romans 10:9-10 – because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.

Stop #4 focuses on helping a person to make the most important decision of his/her life. That decision is to trust in Jesus Christ as personal Lord and Saviour. We are saved through trusting or believing in Jesus Christ (John 1:12).

Romans 10:13 says: For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

So through faith in Jesus Christ we become children of God and part of the kingdom of God. We become born again Christians or followers of Jesus Christ. We have eternal life because we have believed in Jesus Christ and accepted the finished work He did for us on the Cross. We are saved from eternal punishment and are promised eternal life and an eternal relationship with God.

Stop #5 – Romans 5:1 – Therefore, since we have been *justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.*

Stop #5 gives us assurance that through faith in Jesus Christ – we are no longer at enmity with God. Instead we are now at peace with God because we belong to God's family.


Romans 8:1 says that there is *no longer any condemnation for those who are in Jesus Christ.*


Therefore our salvation is not based on our individual effort because we are not justified through our works. Instead our salvation and relationship with God is based on the perfect work of Jesus Christ through His death on the cross and resurrection because it is through faith in Christ alone that we are justified.


Conclusion
